



# CANADA'S FIRST SANCTIONED NATIONAL SIMULATOR COMPETITION

The BDO National Golf League is Golf Canada's national recreational competition, uniting local leagues across the country through Regional Finals and a National Championship. Players compete locally for the opportunity to advance through a structured qualification pathway, culminating in an all-expenses-paid National Championship held at the host venue on the Saturday prior to the RBC Canadian Open. As part of this initiative, Golf Canada is establishing the first nationally sanctioned pathway connecting simulator golf to on-course tournament play. Golf Canada Off-Course Member Facilities will have the opportunity to host and participate in the inaugural Indoor Qualifier, enabling players to compete in facility-run simulator leagues for advancement to outdoor Regional Finals.

## WHY HOST A QUALIFIER

- Differentiate your facility from other simulator venues in your market
- Drive traffic to your facility beginning March 31st
- Offer golfers a competitive pathway tied to a national championship
- Have your league promoted through Just Swing and the National Golf League websites

## HOW THE SIMULATOR SERIES WORKS

1. Facilities host a minimum six-week simulator league (March 31–August 30)
2. Competition format is facility-defined, supported by standardized league guidelines provided by Golf Canada.
3. Top player advances to an outdoor Regional Final

Top Regional Final teams advance to the National Championship, held the week prior to the RBC Canadian Open at the host venue.

## COST

- No cost or financial commitment to host for Off-Course Member Facilities
- Voluntary donations encouraged in support of First Tee – Canada

## NEXT STEPS

1. Sign the Letter of Intent on the National Golf League website
2. Complete a short facility intake survey outlining your league details
3. Your league will be listed and promoted through Golf Canada channels
